Peter is a world renowned anatomist, examiner for over 35 years for FRCS and MRCS and many awards too numerous to list here in the fields of anatomy and education. He has set up a national training centre for international health professionals and been the consultant to the Buckingham Palace exhibition on Leonardo the Anatomist, co -curator for the Mechanics of Man at Edinburgh festival and since 2014 consultant to the Fitzwilliam Museum on the Rothschild Bronzes as well as Director of the Uffizi on the anatomy of the renaissance statues in Florence.
